Apprenticeship Starts - June 2020

Introduction

The following examines data released from the Department of Education regarding apprenticeship starts in England.

Summary Results

All apprenticeships

- Apprenticeship starts between March & May 2020 have fallen by 48% comparing to the same time period the previous year.
- Those starting an apprenticeship who are under 19 have fallen the most of all the age groups.
- Engineering and manufacturing technologies apprenticeship starts have fallen by 68%. This is one of the largest falls, second only to construction, planning and the built environment.

Automotive apprenticeships

- In 2018/19 there were 11,000 automotive apprentice starts which counted for 3% of all apprenticeship starts in England.
- Automotive apprentice starts have fallen by 74% between March & May 2020 compared to the same time period the previous year.
- Those under 19 starting an automotive apprenticeship have also fallen the most of the age groups, with a drop of 79%. However, the difference in age groups is not as significant in comparison to all apprenticeship starts.
- Automotive apprenticeship starts have been declining over the past 5 years. Prior to Covid-19, the first 7 months (Aug-Feb) were down by 28% on the same period the previous year.



Apprenticeship starts between March & May 2020 have fallen by 48% comparing to the same time period the previous year.

Engineering and manufacturing technologies (the high level subject automotive apprenticeships fall under) apprenticeship starts have fallen by 68%. This is one of the largest falls, second only to construction, planning and the built environment.



Automotive apprentice starts have fallen by 74%, which is a larger fall than the average for the Engineering and manufacturing technologies.

Vehicle body and paint have fallen the most (82%).

Those starting an apprenticeship who are under 19 have fallen the most of all the age groups, a drop of 73%. This is significantly more than those aged 19-24 and those 25+, who although have also fallen it is at a rate of between 41%-49%.

Those under 19 starting an automotive apprenticeship have also fallen the most of the age groups, with a drop of 79%. However, the difference in age groups is not as significant in comparison to all apprenticeship starts.

Automotive Apprenticeships overtime





Automotive apprenticeship starts have been declining over the past 5 years. Prior to Covid-19, the first 7 months (Aug-Feb) were down 28% on the same period the previous year.
