Here are some simple things a business can do to help individuals and create a more inclusive and supportive working environment in which people of all abilities can thrive.

- Ask them what they need help with
- S Listen to what they have to say
- $\checkmark$  Move the bin from behind the door so it will open fully
- 🕑 Use desks that are height adjustable
- 🕑 Use desks with round corners
- Make sure that machines, like printers and shredders, are at a working height for anyone who is going to use them
- Make sure there is good working space between workstations both in the workshop and in the office
- Make sure all monitors are fully adjustable
- Create a list of the most used words used in your shop, like a spelling list, and then laminate it
- Colour code recycling bins
- Provide a quiet room or space, and not the smoker's corner!
- If they say they can do something just say "show me". Don't ask "how?" just watch you will learn something



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
